General Rules and Regulations

1. Entries will be received Monday, July 9th from 8:30 to 11:00 a.m. Doors will close for judging promptly at 11:00 a.m.
2. **Pre-registration is required for the 2019 fair. ONLINE REGISTRATION ONLY!**
3. Each class will accept entries for three age division: 12 and under, ages 13-21 and ages 22 and above.
4. Exhibitors may exhibit in as many classes as they wish. However, exhibitors are limited to two exhibits per class.
5. All articles must be the work of the exhibitor.
6. **NO POSTERS WILL BE ACCEPTED.**
7. Any article will not be eligible for competition in the same class in which it was previously exhibited.
8. When there is not competition in a class, articles will be awarded according to merit. No ribbon and premium will be awarded unless quality merits. In classes with one exhibit, first place will be awarded only if the judge(s) feels exhibit is worthy.
9. The Lincoln County Fair will make reasonable effort for a secure display area. The Lincoln County Fair, Inc., members of the board of directors, nor superintendents/assistant superintendents assume no responsibility for loss of or damage to exhibits.
10. Judges decisions are final.
11. Best of Show ribbons will be awarded in the following categories: Breads; Desserts (cakes, cookies, candies); Canned Goods; Sewing; Horticulture; Stitchery; Knitting/Crochet; Quilts; Fine Arts; Photography; Crafts and Woodwork. An additional premium of \$10 will be awarded per category for Best of Show.
12. **ENTRIES MUST BE PICKED UP ON SUNDAY, JULY 15TH FROM 3:00 TO 5:00 P.M.** The Lincoln County Fair and Open Community Exhibits committees are not responsible for articles left after this time and date. Any item left after this time and date forfeit ribbons and any premiums awarded.

Food

1. No mixes allowed except where stated.
2. Amount required per exhibit is listed.
3. All jars must be clear, standard in size and clearly labeled.
4. All other entries must be exhibited on non- breakable containers
5. Only clear plastic wrap may be used on products to be judged.

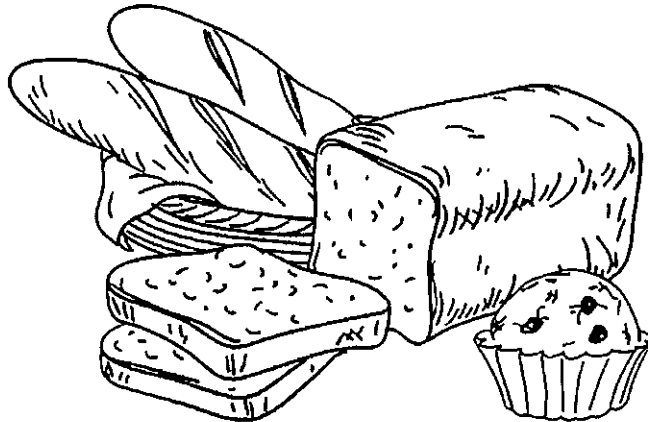

Breads should be plastic wrapped and exhibited on heavy paper plate. An exhibit will consist of ¼ loaf of bread, plate of 4 rolls. Please include two (2) samples, wrapped separately from the exhibit in plastic sandwich bags, for the judging.

5. Only decorated cakes may be from a mix.

1. Cookies should be exhibited on heavy paper plates, covered with plastic wrap.
2. Four (4) cookies will comprise an exhibit.
3. Two (2) cookies as a sample for judging should be wrapped separately.

Division: Canned Foods



The judging guidelines are printed to help you prepare your entries.

1. All canned goods must be in standard canning jars, sealed with two-piece lids, using appropriate heat processing and less than one year old. Paraffin in not an acceptable seal. Bands should be in place for transporting jars, but will be removed for judging.
2. Entries must be labels with product names, date of preparation, processing method, length of processing time and recipe source. Entries with incomplete label will be disqualified. Example of qualified label:

Snap beans 7/20/11 25 minutes	pressure canned 10 pounds University Extension Guide H1454
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3. All foods must be canned according to 1989 or later USDA, University Extension, Ball or Kerr guidelines. (Disclaimer: mention of brand names is for educational purposes only and not an endorsement.) Contact your County Extension Office for help or new recipes.
4. Any sign of spoilage, alteration from standard of processing guidelines or lack of label information will be basis for disqualification of the exhibit.
5. No canned food will be sampled by the judges.

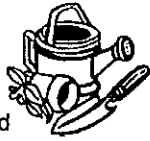

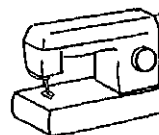

4. All 2-dimensional artwork must be framed and ready for hanging - photography exhibits excluded. a) Artwork not ready for hanging will not be accepted - photography exhibits excluded. b) Only a securely attached wire is acceptable for display. c) All plates must have stand or easel.
5. All artwork must be original and may not be copied from any source.
6. Completed project should not exceed 22" x 28".
