

Open Wool Fleece Contest

Monday, July 12th - Exhibit Hall 8:30 - 11:00 a.m. - Judging at 11:00 a.m.

1. Eligibility of Fleeces: In order to compete for prizes, each fleece must: (a) have been shorn in 2021; (b) represent not more than 12 months growth except with yearling fleeces, 18 months growth will be allowed.

Qualifications: Any entered fleece will be discriminated against if it demonstrates:

- A. Showing any paint or tar brands (soluble branding fluids permissible)
- B. Showing excessive dung locks or tags
- C. Discolored by excessive moisture
- D. Cotted
- E. Showing a weak staple or break in fiber
- F. Containing any excess vegetable matter

2. Preparation of Fleeces: Fleeces will be skirted. and may be tied with paper fleece twine, flesh side out, or They may be presented in a controlled manner to allow their being handled without falling apart or tied PAPER twine

3. Fleeces will be entered on Monday July 12, 8:30 to 11:00 a.m. in the Main Exhibit Hall at the Lincoln County Fairgrounds.

4. Premiums will be paid on 1st through 4th places in each class. Premiums will be: 1st - \$7; 2nd - \$6; 3rd - \$5; 4th - \$4. Best of Show will receive a \$10.00 additional premium.

5. Fleece classes will be:

0400 Fine White Wool (example: Corriedale, Rambouillet)

0401 Medium White Wool (example: Dorset, Montadale; Polypay)

0402 Long/Coarse White Wool (example: Lincoln, Romney, Border Leicester)

0403 Fine Natural Colored Wool

0404 Medium Natural Colored Wool

0405 Long/Coarse Natural Colored Wool

0406 Medium Cream Colored Wool (example: Suffolk; Oxford; Shropshire. Hampshire; Southdown)

0407 Double Coated White Fleece

0408 Double Coated Natural Colored Fleece

NOTE: The breed examples are the same for Fine (0400 and 0403), Medium (0401 and 0404), and Long/Coarse White Wool (0402 and 0405). Each class will accept crossbred fleeces of its definition. Double coated refers to Llama, Alpaca and Churro breeds.

6. Classes may be broken at the discretion of judge and/or chairs.

Junior exhibitors in any county of Missouri may exhibit BREEDING STOCK in the Lincoln County Fair Junior Breeding Shows provided that the exhibitor's home county also provides this option to Lincoln County Junior exhibitors.

1. All exhibitors must comply with the general rules and regulations and Animal Health Requirements for Exhibition in this Premium Book.
2. **"All entries for livestock exhibition MUST BE REGISTERED ONLINE AT <https://lincmobl.fairmanager.com> between May 31 and June 25, 2021. Registration closes at 12:00 PM (noon) on June 25, 2021. Entry fee will be paid through PayPal by credit or debit card."**
3. No breeding livestock will be allowed on the grounds prior to 8:00 a.m. on Friday, July 16.
 - a. SWINE must be penned and ready for check-in from 9:00-11:00 a.m.
Show begins at 12:00 p.m.
 - b. CATTLE arrive from 8:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m. on Friday, July 16.
Check in by 9:30 am.
 - c. SHEEP arrive by 12:00 PM (noon) on Friday, July 16. Check in by 1:00 pm.
4. All Health Papers and registration papers are to be delivered to the Livestock Superintendent or Veterinarian at check-in.
5. Each Exhibitor will be expected to keep their pens and areas clean. Sawdust will be provided in cattle barn. However, exhibitors are still responsible for keeping the exhibit area clean and orderly. No straw bedding will be allowed in cattle barn.
6. Abuse of animals will not be tolerated. Should an abuse be observed toward an animal, either in the barn or in the show ring, superintendent has the authority to dismiss/disqualify animal and exhibitor from the show.

7. No assistance in showing animals will be allowed in classes unless approved by the show officials.
8. Swine Breeding Shows will be at 12:00 p.m. on Friday July 16, Cattle Breeding Show will 3:00 p.m. on Friday, July 16 or immediately following swine show. Release date and time for the Swine and Cattle Junior Breeding Show is Friday, July 16 at conclusion of respective show. Sheep Breeding Shows will be on Saturday, July 17 starting at 9:00 am. Sheep will be eligible for release at the conclusion of the Sheep Breeding Show.
9. No grooming chutes will be allowed in the show barns except day of show.
10. If there are two or less exhibitors in one breed, they will be shown in a combined class at the discretion of the show committee.
11. Errors in premium payments not reported to Lincoln County Fair by August 31, will stand as paid.
12. No dogs are allowed on the Fairgrounds.
13. ELIGIBILITY OF 4-H & FFA MEMBERS

4-H members who have passed their 8th birthday and not passed their 19th birthday before January 1 of the current program year are eligible. Active members of High School FFA Chapters (9th grade and above) who are continuing their supervised agricultural experience program are eligible. Members of both the 4-H youth development program and FFA must be in good standing with their respective organizations.

14. CODE OF ETHICS

Believing it is in the best interest of all junior exhibitors to maintain a reputation of integrity and to present a wholesome and progressive image, the Lincoln County Fair sets forth the following regulation: 4-H and FFA members are expected to conduct themselves according to the best traditions of their respective organizations. Inappropriate conduct (drinking, vandalism, stealing and indiscreet behavior) WILL NOT BE TOLERATED. Any violation of this rule will be grounds for disqualifying the exhibitor and/or livestock involved. Further, any premium monies and/ or awards earned will be forfeited.

15. CHECK-IN WITH SUPERINTENDENTS

Upon arrival at the fairground, contact should be made with the Breeding Livestock Superintendent for your division. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to have their entries checked in with the superintendents listed in the show books.

16. SHOWING

- a. Uncontrollable animals or animals which the exhibitor cannot handle alone, may be disqualified by the Superintendent and required to leave the ring.
- b. In cases where a member has more than one animal in a class, another junior exhibitor must show the animal.
- c. Minimal assistance is allowed by another junior exhibitor at the discretion of the superintendent.

17. PUBLIC RELATIONS

All stalls and pens must be cleaned before 8:00 a.m. each day and refuse deposited as directed by the superintendent. No advertising of feeds or other agricultural products will be permitted in or around the grounds or stalls. All cots, bedding, and other personal belongings must be kept out of the aisles and stalls between 8:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m.

Behavior of exhibitors will influence public opinion of their organizations. They are expected to conduct themselves in a proper manner.

18. COMPLIANCE REGULATIONS

Any exhibitor who refuses to parade their animal(s) when asked to do so by the superintendent in charge, or who otherwise disobeys rules in the fair book, will thereby forfeit their right to exhibit and any premium they may already have won. All livestock exhibits will be exhibited at the sole risk of the exhibitor.

19. FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH THE ABOVE REGULATIONS AND SPECIES REGULATIONS, WILL RESULT IN THE FORFEITURE OF ANY AND ALL PREMIUMS WON.

2. Swine must have been owned by the exhibitor 90 days prior to showing. Exhibitors must provide proof of ownership, registration papers or dated bill of sale.
3. Exhibitor can show 4 different breeds.

5. Boars of any breed listed above can be shown. NO BARROWS
6. Birthdates of Gilts and Boars must be after December 1st.
7. **All entries for livestock exhibition MUST BE REGISTERED ONLINE AT <https://lincmobl.fairmanager.com> between May 31 and June 25, 2021. Registration closes at 12:00 PM (noon) on June 25, 2021. Entry fee will be paid through PayPal by credit or debit card."**
8. There is a \$5.00 fee per head per exhibitor.
9. Awards will be as followed for each class:

 - 2nd place \$7.00
 - 3rd place \$5.00
 - 4th place \$3.00
 - Grand Breed Champion \$25.00

10. Boars will be paid depending on entries, but is guarantee to win first, second and Breed Champion awards. Must have at least 10 to qualify for Overall Champion awards.
11. All exhibitors must comply with the general rules and regulations and Animal Health Requirements for Exhibition in the Premium book.
12. All pure breed registrations papers are to be given to the Livestock Superintendent or show committee at check in.
13. Each Exhibitor will be expected to keep their pens and area clean. No shavings allowed in pig barn.
14. Abuse of animals will not be tolerated; should an abuse be observed toward an animal, either in the barn or in the show ring, superintendent has the authority to dismiss/disqualify animal and exhibitor from the show.
15. No assistance in showing animals will be allowed in classes unless approved by the show officials.
16. Breeding swine will be allowed on the grounds starting at 8 am, check in will be from 9am to 11 am, show to start at 12 noon. All swine must be removed from premises by 4pm or conclusion of show.
17. All livestock vehicles and trailers shall enter through livestock gate at the Northwest corner of fairgrounds. After unloading livestock trucks and trailers can be parked by horse show arena.
18. No dogs are allowed on premises.
19. Please understand that we are changing the Junior Swine Breeding and Open show to a Lincoln County Swine Breeding Show, so the rules and regulations have changed for **swine only**.

1. For information on livestock exposition regulations contact Missouri Department of Agriculture Animal Health Division 573-751-3377.
2. Refer to Breeding Show Rules in the Lincoln County Fair Book.
3. Sheep must be owned by an individual or farm by July 1, 2021. Exhibitors must have proof of ownership prior to the July 1 date, registration papers or dated bill of sale.
4. **All entries for livestock exhibition MUST BE REGISTERED ONLINE AT <https://lincmobl.fairmanager.com> between May 31 and June 25, 2021. Registration closes at 12:00 PM (noon) on June 25, 2021. Entry fee will be paid through PayPal by credit or debit card."**
5. Entries for sheep are as follows: Exhibitors can enter 11 entries per breed, 22 entries maximum.
6. There is a \$2.00 fee per head per exhibitor.

7. All livestock exhibitors and family members attending must purchase a daily admission ticket or season pass according to the fee schedule on the Livestock Entry Form. Daily passes may be purchased at the Gate of Entry.
8. All livestock vehicles must enter through livestock gate in the northwest corner of the fairgrounds. NO trucks or trailers will be permitted to park behind barns except while loading and unloading. After unloading livestock trailers may park in the restricted parking area west of the horse show arena. Any vehicle found in restricted areas without the proper stickers are subject to towing at owner's expense.
9. Age basis: September 1 is to be used as a base date for computing ages of sheep in all classes. Only those animals that have lamb teeth will be eligible to show in lamb classes and only those animals with yearling teeth will be permitted to show in yearling classes. Sheep and lambs may be mouthed if there is a question on age. The age of all yearlings will be September 1, 2019 to December 31, 2020, spring lambs January 1, 2020 to present.
10. DEFINITIONS: BEST PAIR-1 ram and 1 ewe, any age. Animals in "Best Pair" classes must have been exhibited in one of the classes in respective age division.
11. Awards will be; Champion & Reserve Champion Ram-each breed; Champion & Reserve Champion Ewe-each breed; Supreme Champion Ram, Supreme Champion Ewe in Junior Classes only.
12. Premiums: Blue \$10; Red \$8; White \$6
13. Awards will be Champion & Reserve Champion Ram-each breed; Champion & Reserve Champion Ewe each breed.

Rabbit Junior Breeding Show

(Immediately following Market Show)

1. **All entries for livestock exhibition MUST BE REGISTERED ONLINE AT <https://lincmobl.fairmanager.com> between May 31 and June 25, 2021. Registration closes at 12:00 PM (noon) on June 25, 2021. Entry fee will be paid through PayPal by credit or debit card."**
2. Individuals wishing to exhibit rabbits at the Lincoln County Fair must be a member in good standing with a 4-H Club or FFA Chapter. All 4-H and FFA members must attend a minimum of 6 rabbit project meetings to be eligible to show. This requirement must be met by June 15th.
3. Each member must have a minimum of two (2) does and one (1) buck by January 1 or earlier. Exception: if more than one member from a family and all own the same breed of rabbit, the members may share one buck, but each member must have their own minimum of two (2) does.
4. At the Lincoln County Fair, each member must show his/her own rabbits. No one is allowed to help in the barn during the show except other rabbit project members. Older members are expected to assist the new/younger members as needed. Exception: if a member is sick (under a doctor's care), in the hospital, or has an injury

that prevents them from safely carrying their rabbits (broken bone) another rabbit project member may show their rabbits for them. County rabbit leader should be notified prior to the show if this is necessary.

5. Breeder rabbits must be purebred (follow ARBA Standard of Perfection).
6. Entrants will follow the General Junior Livestock rules and regulations.
7. Entrants are limited to a maximum of 25 animals. Exhibitor may have no more than one (1) Market Fryer rabbit, one (1) meat pen. In the breeding classes, each exhibitor will be limited to showing two (2) breeds per class and two (2) rabbits per breed. Exhibitor may have no more than four (4) entries in an individual breeding class.
8. Member must complete the 4-H/FFA Junior Show entry in ShoWorks by required date, no exceptions.
9. A.R.B.A. standards are used as a guideline for the Lincoln County Rabbit Fair Show.
10. Premiums: Blue \$5; Red \$4; White \$3
11. There is no Open Rabbit Breeding Show

IAFE (INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF FAIRS AND EXPOSITIONS) NATIONAL CODE OF SHOW RING ETHICS

Exhibitors of animals at livestock shows shall at all times deport themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their conduct in this competitive environment shall always reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of agricultural education. This code applies to junior as well as open class exhibitors who compete in structured classes of competition. This code applies to all livestock offered in any event at a livestock show. In addition to the "IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics," fairs and livestock shows may have rules and regulations which they impose on the local, county, state, provincial and national levels.

All youth leaders working with junior exhibitors are under an affirmative responsibility to do more than avoid improper conduct or questionable acts. (Their moral values must be so certain and positive that those younger and more pliable will be influenced by their fine example.) Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers and absolutely responsible persons who violate the code of ethics will forfeit premiums, awards and auction proceeds and shall be prohibited from future exhibition in accordance with the rules adopted by the respective fairs and livestock shows. (Exhibitors who violate this code of ethics lessen the integrity of all livestock exhibitors and should be prohibited from competition at all livestock shows in the United States and Canada.)

The following is a list of guidelines for all exhibitors and all livestock in competitive events: 1. All exhibitors must present, upon request of fair and livestock show officials, proof of ownership, length of ownership and age of all animals entered. Misrepresentation of ownership, age, or any facts relating thereto is prohibited

2. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers, or absolutely responsible persons shall provide animal health certificates from licensed veterinarians upon request by fair or livestock show officials

3. Junior exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their animals while at fairs or livestock shows.

4. Animals shall be presented to show events where they will enter the food chain free of violative drug residues. The act of entering an animal in a livestock show is giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer and/or absolutely responsible person for show management to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood, or other substances from the animal to be used in testing.

Animals not entered in an event which culminates with the animal entering the food chain shall not be administered drugs other than in accordance with applicable federal, state and provincial statutes, regulations and rules. (Livestock shall not be exhibited if the drugs administered in accordance with federal, state and provincial statutes, regulations and rules affect the animal's performance or appearance at the event.)

If the laboratory report on the analyzed saliva, urine, blood, or the sample taken from livestock indicates the presence of forbidden drugs or medication, this shall be prima facie evidence such substance has been administered to the animal either internally or externally. It is presumed that the sample of urine, saliva, blood, or other substances tested by the laboratory to which it is sent is the one taken from the animal in question, its integrity is preserved and all procedures of said collection and preservation, transfer to the laboratory and analysis of the sample are correct and accurate and thereport received from the

laboratory pertains to the sample taken from the animal in question and correctly reflects the condition of the animal at the time the sample was taken, with the burden on the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to prove otherwise.

At any time after an animal arrives on the fair or livestock show premises, all treatments involving the use of drugs and/or medications for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal shall be administered by a licensed veterinarian.

5. Any surgical procedure or injection of any foreign substance or drug or the external application of any substance (irritant, counterirritant, or similar substance) which could affect the animal's performance or alter its natural contour, confirmation, or appearance, except external applications of substances to the hoofs or horns of animals which affect appearance only and except for surgical procedures performed by a duly licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal, is prohibited.

6. The use of showing and/or handling practices or devices such as striking animals to cause swelling, using electrical contrivance, or other similar practices are not acceptable and are prohibited.

7. Direct criticism or interference with the judge, fair or livestock show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives, or show officials before, during, or after the competitive event is prohibited. In the furtherance of their official duty, all judges, fair and livestock show management, or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation and respect and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them.

8. No owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person shall conspire with an other person or persons to intentionally violate this code of ethics or knowingly contribute or cooperate with another person or persons either by affirmative action or inaction to violate this code of ethics. Violation of this rule shall subject such individual to disciplinary action.

9. The application of this code of ethics provides for absolute responsibility for an animal's condition by an owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or participant whether or not he or she was actually instrumental in or had actual knowledge of the treatment of the animal in violation of this code of ethics.

10. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to have disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show for violation of this Code of Show Ring Ethics and any other rules of competition of the fair or livestock show without recourse against the fair or livestock show. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent that any proceedings or disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show may be published with the name of the violator or violators in any publication of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions, including *Fairs and Expositions* and any special notices to members.

11. The act of entering an animal in a fair or livestock show is the giving of verification by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainers, or absolutely responsible person that he or she has read the IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics and understands the consequences of and penalties provided for actions prohibited by the code. It is further a consent that any action which violates these rules and is also in violation of federal, state, or provincial statutes, regulations, or rules may be released to appropriate law enforcement authorities with jurisdiction over such infractions.

NOTIFICATION REGARDING PHOTOGRAPHING YOUTH PARTICIPATION AT THE FAIR

Public Relations are an important part of the Lincoln County Fair. Photographs are used in various print and electronic media to recognize members for their work and to let others know what is happening at the Lincoln County Fair. If you prefer that your child not be photographed at LCF events, we want to work with you to keep his or her photo from being taken. Because there are so many youth involved in the Lincoln County Fair, we cannot assure you that your child will not be photographed. We will ask official photographers to honor individual's requests not to be photographed. Please visit with your children about your wishes and encourage them to let photographers know that they request not to be photographed. Should a photo of your child be made and used against your wishes, please let us know so that we will not use it again in the future.


