The longevity of the Lincoln County Fair could not be possible without the countless volunteers that make it happen. Each year, the Fair Board names a "Friend of the Fair" acknowledging the contributions of time and talent. It is our honor to name Kathy Allen the 2023 Friend of the Fair!

Kathy says "For as long as I can remember, I have gone to the Lincoln County Fair. As a child, Mom and Dad would load five girls up and head to the county fair. At that time, it was held in the city limits at the Troy City Park. In the beginning years I looked forward to being old enough to join 4-H, show a steer, and participate in the Foods and Clothing group within our local chapter. My parents saw that I was involved in all that I could be. I have extremely fond memories of baking and sewing with my mom and spending countless hours

with Dad breaking a steer. I later went on to become a fair queen candidate my senior year of high school. I recall as a teenager and young adult, the fair was a great place to congregate and catch up during the summer."

"In 1982, Nick became the Lincoln County Fair Chairman. That same year I started my volunteer work in the food stand. I recall it was a concrete building behind the track and miserably hot! Nick chose Jerry Fox as his co-chairman and this is when the conversations started to evolve that it was time to find property to become an independent fair. Property was located and purchased which is now the current home to the annual Lincoln County Fair. Nick and I were proud to be a part of that progress within our community. Mary Ann Fox and I went on to work and lead the food stand for several more years until we stepped down and moved to the Information Booth which I currently still lead and maintain each year at the Fair."

"I have watched countless volunteers over the years working to continue to improve the fair, more land has been purchased with upgrades to the property each year. I am very proud to still be a part of such a great community involvement."

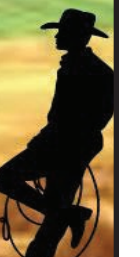

FAIR PARADE

Sunday, July 9, 2023 at 5pm

Please join us for the 62nd annual Lincoln County Fair Parade through Downtown Troy. This annual event draws thousands of visitors to the community to kick off the week-long fair.

GENERAL PARADE INFORMATION

*****NEW Route:** The parade will **START at Troy Buchanan High School**. The route will go West on Old Cap Au Gris, West on Monroe Street through Fairgrounds Park, North on Main Street, West on College Street, and the parade will **END at Troy Middle School**.

Entry Details: Judged floats entries must return the completed attached entry form by **June 30th**. General entries **DO NOT** need to complete a form and will not be judged. **Semis and Political entries must arrive by 3:30pm** on the day of the parade and must call or text Megan at 314-540-0088 that you will be participating. Walkers can join closer to start time, but the vehicle must be there by 3:30pm.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. **City Ordinances should be followed**, specifically no items being thrown to spectators during the parade, including candy. Those wishing to distribute items must have person(s) walking to hand out items.
2. Participants and spectators must obey directions from City and/or County Police Officers.
3. **Parade route ends at Troy Middle School so please coordinate pick-up and drop-off at the Middle School.** Individuals are not allowed to ride on floats while being towed outside of the parade route including through town or on Hwy 47 or 61. Outside of the parade route, drivers and motorcyclists must have a license and be insured and motorcyclists must wear helmets.
4. The parade officials **REQUIRE those entering horses provide clean-up crew or have horses wear a catch apparatus**. If clean-up crew or catch apparatus is not provided then horse entries will be put at the end of the parade line-up (for horses at the end of the route, please keep your horses in the shade & watered until final parade entries are lined-up, around 6 pm and then come up to line-up area)
5. Business and Political entries are limited to two units. A unit is described as any motorized or horse drawn conveyance. A pull vehicle and connected trailer are considered one unit.
6. Bikes and motorcycles must not be operated recklessly and must stay within parade diameters by not driving close to the crowd.
7. If entries/vehicles would like to go through the parade route together, entries/vehicles must arrive together.
8. Parade entries must be dressed and act in a family friendly, G-Rated, manner.
9. Animals must be constrained and kept on float at all times during the parade route.

1. Eligibility of Fleeces to compete for placing, each fleece must:
 - a. Have been shorn in 2023;
 - b. Represent not more than 12 months growth except with yearling fleeces, 18 months growth will be allowed.
 - c. Qualifications: Any entered fleece will be discriminated against if it demonstrates any of the following:
 - 1.) Showing any paint or tar brands, but soluble branding fluids are permissible.
 - 2.) Showing excessive dung locks or tags
 - 3.) Discolored by excessive moisture
 - 4.) Cotted or matted
 - 5.) Showing a weak staple or break in fiber
 - 6.) Containing any excess vegetable matter
2. A maximum of 4 fleece entries per person, adult, 4H or FFA will be allowed.
3. Preparation of Fleeces: Fleeces will be skirted and may be tied with paper twine, flesh side out, or they may be presented in a controlled manner to allow them being handled without falling apart i.e. wrapped in a large piece of cloth or sheet, in a basket or decorative box or container.
4. All fleeces, lamb yearling or adult must be the whole fleece properly skirted (see qualifications). Partial fleece entries will be disqualified.
5. Fleeces will be entered on Monday July 10, 8:30 to 11:00 a.m. in the Main Exhibit Hall at the Lincoln County Fair Grounds. Judging will begin at 11:00 a.m. Pre-Fair entries are not necessary.
6. Premiums will be paid on 1st through 4th places in each class. Premiums will be: 1st - \$7; 2nd - \$6; 3rd - \$5; 4th - \$4. Best of Show will receive a \$10.00 additional premium.
7. Fleece Classes will be:
 - 0400 Fine White Wool (example: Corriedale, Rambouillet)
 - 0401 Medium White Wool (example: Dorset, Montadale, Polypay)
 - 0402 Long/Coarse White Wool (example: Lincoln, Border Leicester, Cotswold)
 - 0403 Fine Natural Colored Wool
 - 0404 Medium Natural Colored Wool
 - 0405 Long Coarse Natural Colored Wool
 - 0406 Medium Cream Colored Wool (example: Suffolk, Oxford, Shropshire, Hampshire)
 - 0407 Double Coated White Fleece
 - 0408 Double Coated Natural Colored Fleece

NOTE: The breed examples are the same for Fine (0400 and 0403) Medium (0401, 0404 and 0406) and Long/Coarse (0402 and 0405). Each class will accept crossbred fleeces of its definition. Double coated refers to Llama, Alpaca and Churro breeds.
8. Classes may be broken at the discretion of the judge and/or event chairpersons.

Junior exhibitors in any county of Missouri may exhibit BREEDING STOCK in the Lincoln County Fair Junior Breeding Shows provided that the exhibitor's home county also provides this option to Lincoln County Junior exhibitors.

1. All exhibitors must comply with the general rules and regulations and Animal Health Requirements for Exhibition in this Premium Book.
2. "All entries for livestock exhibition MUST BE REGISTERED ONLINE AT <https://lincobl.fairmanager.com> between June 6 and June 29, 2023. Registration closes at 5:00 p.m. on June 29, 2023. Entry fee will be paid through PayPal by credit or debit card."
3. No breeding livestock will be allowed on the grounds prior to 8:00 a.m. on Friday, July 14.
 - a. SWINE must be penned and ready for check-in from 9:00-11:00 a.m. Show begins at 12:00 p.m.
 - b. CATTLE arrive from 8:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m. on Friday, July 14. Check in by 9:30 a.m.
 - c. SHEEP arrive by 12:00 p.m. (noon) on Friday, July 14. Check in by 1:00 p.m.
4. All Health Papers and registration papers are to be delivered to the Livestock Superintendent or Veterinarian at check-in.
5. Each Exhibitor will be expected to keep their pens and areas clean. Sawdust will be provided in cattle barn. However, exhibitors are still responsible for keeping the exhibit area clean and orderly. No straw bedding will be allowed in cattle barn.
6. Abuse of animals will not be tolerated. Should an abuse be observed toward an animal, either in the barn or in the show ring, superintendent has the authority to dismiss/disqualify animal and exhibitor from the show.
7. No assistance in showing animals will be allowed in classes unless approved by the show officials.
8. Swine Breeding Shows will be at 12:00 p.m. on Friday July 14. Cattle Breeding Show will 3:00 p.m. on Friday, July 14 or immediately following the Swine Show. Release date and time for the Swine and Cattle Junior Breeding Show is Friday, July 14 at the conclusion of the respective show. Sheep Breeding Shows will be on Saturday, July 16, starting at 9:00 a.m. Sheep will be eligible for release at the conclusion of the Sheep Breeding Show.
9. No grooming chutes will be allowed in the show barns except day of show.
10. If there are two or less exhibitors in one breed, they will be shown in a combined class at the discretion of the show committee.
11. Errors in premium payments not reported to Lincoln County Fair by August 31, will stand as paid.

12. No dogs are allowed on the Fairgrounds.

13. ELIGIBILITY OF 4-H & FFA MEMBERS

4-H members who have passed their 8th birthday and not passed their 19th birthday before January 1 of the current program year are eligible. Active members of High School FFA Chapters (9th grade and above) who are continuing their supervised agricultural experience program are eligible. Members of both the 4-H youth development program and FFA must be in good standing with their respective organizations.

14. CODE OF ETHICS

Believing it is in the best interest of all junior exhibitors to maintain a reputation of integrity and to present a wholesome and progressive image, the Lincoln County Fair sets forth the following regulation: 4-H and FFA members are expected to conduct themselves according to the best traditions of their respective organizations. Inappropriate conduct (drinking, vandalism, stealing and indiscreet behavior) WILL NOT BE TOLERATED. Any violation of this rule will be grounds for disqualifying the exhibitor and/or livestock involved. Further, any premium monies and/ or awards earned will be forfeited.

15. CHECK-IN WITH SUPERINTENDENTS

Upon arrival at the fairground, contact should be made with the Breeding Livestock Superintendent for your division. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to have their entries checked in with the superintendents listed in the show books.

16. SHOWING

- a. Uncontrollable animals or animals which the exhibitor cannot handle alone, may be disqualified by the Superintendent and required to leave the ring.
- b. In cases where a member has more than one animal in a class, another junior exhibitor must show the animal.
- c. Minimal assistance is allowed by another junior exhibitor at the discretion of the superintendent.

17. PUBLIC RELATIONS

All stalls and pens must be cleaned before 8:00 a.m. each day and refuse deposited as directed by the superintendent. No advertising of feeds or other agricultural products will be permitted in or around the grounds or stalls. All cots, bedding, and other personal belongings must be kept out of the aisles and stalls between 8:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m.

Behavior of exhibitors will influence public opinion of their organizations. They are expected to conduct themselves in a proper manner.

18. COMPLIANCE REGULATIONS

Any exhibitor who refuses to parade their animal(s) when asked to do so by the superintendent in charge, or who otherwise disobeys rules in the fair book, will thereby forfeit their right to exhibit and any premium they may already have won. All livestock exhibits will be exhibited at the sole risk of the exhibitor.

19. FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH THE ABOVE REGULATIONS AND SPECIES REGULATIONS, WILL RESULT IN THE FORFEITURE OF ANY AND ALL PREMIUMS WON.

1. All entries for livestock exhibition MUST BE REGISTERED ONLINE AT <https://lincobl.fairmanager.com> between June 5th and June 28th, 2023. Registration closes at 5:00 p.m. on June 28th, 2023. Entry fee will be paid through PayPal by credit or debit card.
2. Individuals wishing to exhibit rabbits at the Lincoln County Fair must be a member in good standing with a 4-H Club or FFA Chapter. All 4-H and FFA members must attend a minimum of 6 rabbit project meetings to be eligible to show. This requirement must be met by June 15th.
3. Each member must have a minimum of two (2) does and one (1) buck by January 1 or earlier. Exception: if more than one member from a family and all own the same breed of rabbit, the members may share one buck, but each member must have their own minimum of two (2) does.
4. At the Lincoln County Fair, each member must show his/her own rabbits. No one is allowed to help in the barn during the show except other rabbit project members. Older members are expected to assist the new/younger members as needed. Exception: If a member is sick (under a doctor's care), in the hospital, or has an injury that prevents them from safely carrying their rabbits (broken bone) another rabbit project member may show their rabbits for them. County rabbit leader should be notified prior to the show if this is necessary.
5. Breeder rabbits must be purebred (follow ARBA Standard of Perfection).
6. Entrants will follow the General Junior Livestock rules and regulations.
7. Entrants are limited to a maximum of 25 animals. Exhibitor may have no more than one (1) Market Fryer rabbit, one (1) meat pen. In the breeding classes, each exhibitor will be limited to showing two (2) breeds per class and two (2) rabbits per breed. Exhibitor may have no more than four (4) entries in an individual breeding class.
8. Member must complete the 4-H/FFA Junior Show entry in ShoWorks by required date, no exceptions.
9. A.R.B.A. standards are used as a guideline for the Lincoln County Rabbit Fair Show.
10. Premiums: Blue \$5; Red \$4; White \$3
11. There is no Open Rabbit Breeding Show.

IAFE (INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF FAIRS AND EXPOSITIONS) NATIONAL CODE OF SHOW RING ETHICS

Exhibitors of animals at livestock shows shall at all times deport themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their conduct in this competitive environment shall always reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of agricultural education. This code applies to junior as well as open class exhibitors who compete in structured classes of competition. This code applies to all livestock offered in any event at a livestock show. In addition to the "IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics," fairs and livestock shows may have rules and regulations which they impose on the local, county, state, provincial and national levels.

All youth leaders working with junior exhibitors are under an affirmative responsibility to do more than avoid improper conduct or questionable acts. (Their moral values must be so certain and positive that those younger and more pliable will be influenced by their fine example.) Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers and absolutely responsible persons who violate the code of ethics will forfeit premiums, awards and auction proceeds and shall be prohibited from future exhibition in accordance with the rules adopted by the respective fairs and livestock shows. (Exhibitors who violate this code of ethics lessen the integrity of all livestock exhibitors and should be prohibited from competition at all livestock shows in the United States and Canada.)

The following is a list of guidelines for all exhibitors and all livestock in competitive events: 1. All exhibitors must present, upon request of fair and livestock show officials, proof of ownership, length of ownership and age of all animals entered. Misrepresentation of ownership, age, or any facts relating thereto is prohibited

2. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers, or absolutely responsible persons shall provide animal health certificates from licensed veterinarians upon request by fair or livestock show officials

3. Junior exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their animals while at fairs or livestock shows.

4. Animals shall be presented to show events where they will enter the food chain free of violative drug residues. The act of entering an animal in a livestock show is giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer and/or absolutely responsible person for show management to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood, or other substances from the animal to be used in testing.

Animals not entered in an event which culminates with the animal entering the food chain shall not be administered drugs other than in accordance with applicable federal, state and provincial statutes, regulations and rules. (Livestock shall not be exhibited if the drugs administered in accordance with federal, state and provincial statutes, regulations and rules affect the animal's performance or appearance at the event.)

If the laboratory report on the analyzed saliva, urine, blood, or the sample taken from livestock indicates the presence of forbidden drugs or medication, this shall be prima facie evidence such substance has been administered to the animal either internally or externally. It is presumed that the sample of urine, saliva, blood, or other substances tested by the laboratory to which it is sent is the one taken from the animal in question, its integrity is preserved and all procedures of said collection and preservation, transfer to the laboratory and analysis of the sample are correct and accurate and thereport received from the

laboratory pertains to the sample taken from the animal in question and correctly reflects the condition of the animal at the time the sample was taken, with the burden on the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to prove otherwise.

At any time after an animal arrives on the fair or livestock show premises, all treatments involving the use of drugs and/or medications for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal shall be administered by a licensed veterinarian.

5. Any surgical procedure or injection of any foreign substance or drug or the external application of any substance (irritant, counterirritant, or similar substance) which could affect the animal's performance or alter its natural contour, confirmation, or appearance, except external applications of substances to the hoofs or horns of animals which affect appearance only and except for surgical procedures performed by a duly licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal, is prohibited.

6. The use of showing and/or handling practices or devices such as striking animals to cause swelling, using electrical contrivance, or other similar practices are not acceptable and are prohibited.

7. Direct criticism or interference with the judge, fair or livestock show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives, or show officials before, during, or after the competitive event is prohibited. In the furtherance of their official duty, all judges, fair and livestock show management, or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation and respect and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them.

8. No owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person shall conspire with an other person or persons to intentionally violate this code of ethics or knowingly contribute or cooperate with another person or persons either by affirmative action or inaction to violate this code of ethics. Violation of this rule shall subject such individual to disciplinary action.

9. The application of this code of ethics provides for absolute responsibility for an animal's condition by an owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or participant whether or not he or she was actually instrumental in or had actual knowledge of the treatment of the animal in violation of this code of ethics.

10. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to have disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show for violation of this Code of Show Ring Ethics and any other rules of competition of the fair or livestock show without recourse against the fair or livestock show. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent that any proceedings or disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show may be published with the name of the violator or violators in any publication of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions, including *Fairs and Expositions* and any special notices to members.

11. The act of entering an animal in a fair or livestock show is the giving of verification by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainers, or absolutely responsible person that he or she has read the IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics and understands the consequences of and penalties provided for actions prohibited by the code. It is further a consent that any action which violates these rules and is also in violation of federal, state, or provincial statutes, regulations, or rules may be released to appropriate law enforcement authorities with jurisdiction over such infractions.

Public Relations are an important part of the Lincoln County Fair. Photographs are used in various print and electronic media to recognize members for their work and to let others know what is happening at the Lincoln County Fair. If you prefer that your child not be photographed at LCF events, we want to work with you to keep his or her photo from being taken. Because there are so many youth involved in the Lincoln County Fair, we cannot assure you that your child will not be photographed. We will ask official photographers to honor individual's requests not to be photographed. Please visit with your children about your wishes and encourage them to let photographers know that they request not to be photographed. Should a photo of your child be made and used against your wishes, please let us know so that we will not use it again in the future.

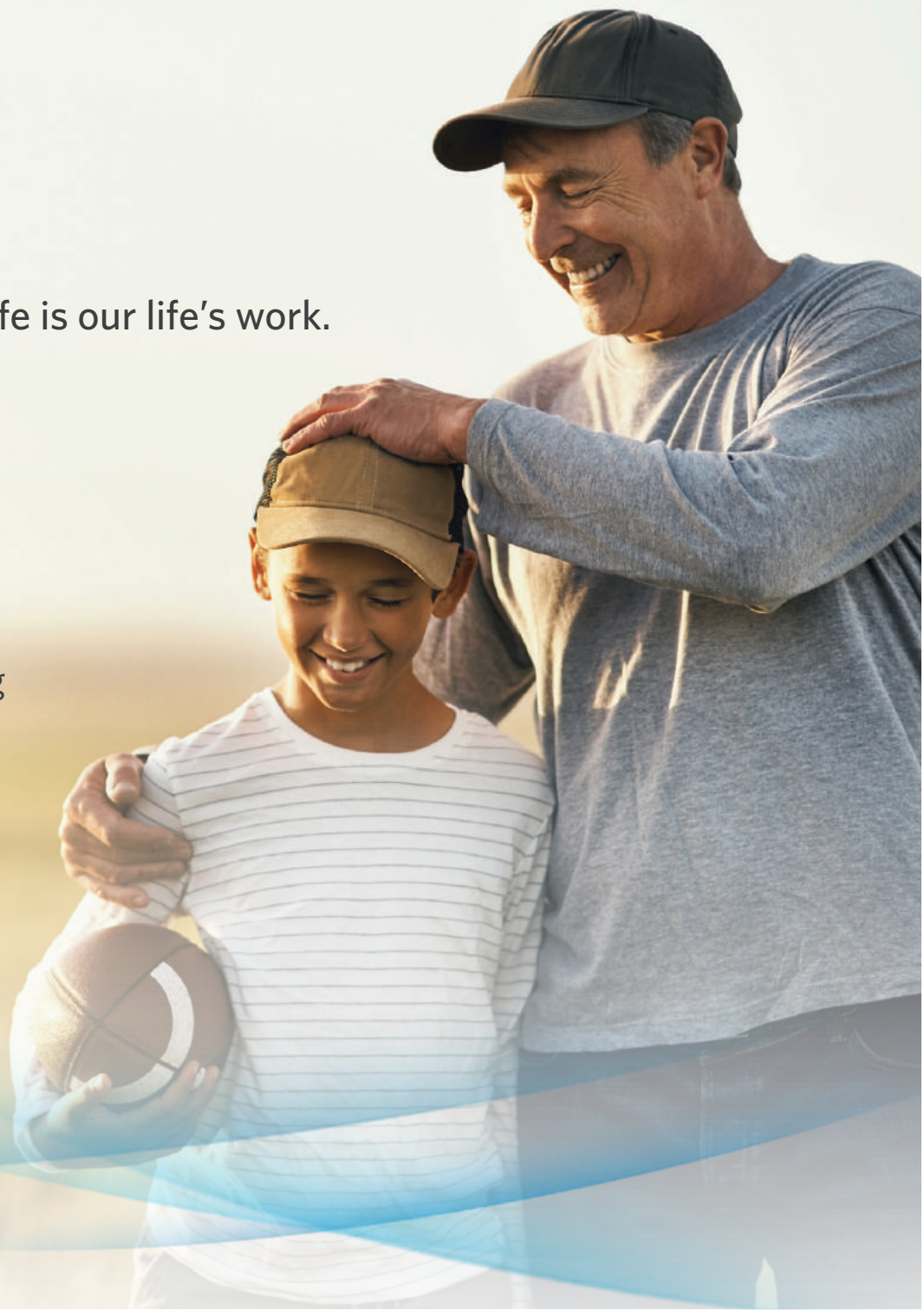

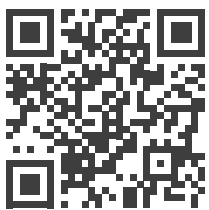
